In Italia

A friend recently mentioned that she would be in Italy visiting her grandmother on Mother's Day. I don't know why I was surprised to learn that Mother's Day is celebrated in Italy on the same day as it is celebrated in the United States. My friend told me that it is not quite the commercialized version of the U.S. Mother's Day, but, indeed, it is celebrated by visits to one's mother and grandmother. It is her family's tradition to meet at nonna's house where everyone except nonna cooks, serves and cleans after the meal.

A little research confirmed that the American holiday of Mother's Day was adopted in Italy in 1957 and "la festa della mamma" has become a popular family tradition. Those who are able return home and those who cannot make sure they send a card, a letter, a poem, or a phone call. Italian phone companies record their highest volume of calls all year as children take the opportunity to express their appreciation to "mamma."

Handsome Tony

When you live in a small town, everyone knows each other, especially the young men and women. On Saturdays and Sundays most of the people in town would stay home from work. Saturday usually was the day that we would do the house cleaning or go to the barber for a shave or haircut. Also, on Saturdays we would go shopping for food, clothing, shoes, etc. On Sunday we would go to church for Sunday Mass, and after that we would visit family members or relatives and have afternoon lunch together, a lunch that sometimes would go on for hours. On Saturday and Sunday evenings, even in the Winter (usually the temperature was as mild as late Autumn in New York), most of the people would go to “la piazza” (the large square in the center of the town) for “la passeggiata,” where we would walk up and down, greeting our friends and relatives. But it also was the time for the young men and young women to parade up and down the Square, eyeing each other and secretly smiling at each other. There was no dating as we know it. With the approval of both families a young man and woman would “court” and were always chaperoned, sometimes by entire families. With the blessing of both sets of parents the couple would become engaged.

There were a few young men considered the “catch of the town” at the time I was growing up, and my brother Tony was one of them. When you are 6-feet 2-inches tall and all your friends and most of the people around you are 5-feet 6- or 8-inches tall, you definitely stick out from the crowd. Tony was handsome with very dark hair and very deep, dark eyes. I knew for sure he was the “dream catch” for many of the young girls in town. But for a young man with ambition, the small town was not offering much for his future. Although I remember many fathers coming to my parents’ house offering large properties, big houses, and plenty of money to Tony as a wedding gift if he would marry their daughters. Tony’s adventurous spirit would not settle that easily. He applied and studied to become a carabinieri (policeman). He passed the test and was sent to Torino (Turin) for three years, and then to Milano (Milan), where he became part of a special elite unit of 14 who are responsible for guarding every Minister or other important person visiting Milano. There are over 25 thousand carabinieri in Milano.

One summer when he was on vacation and back at our house, he met a young girl from New York who was visiting some relatives in town. They immediately took a liking to each other and decided to write to one another. The following year they got married, and he is the reason why I’m in this great country today.

And that’s the way it was somewhere in time in Sicily.

Tribute to Michael A. Valente, Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient

“A nation reveals itself not only by the men it produces, but also by the men it honors, the men it remembers.” *President John F. Kennedy.*

March 25th marked National Medal of Honor Day. The Medal of Honor was created during the American Civil War and is the highest military decoration presented by the United States government to a member of its armed forces. The recipients must have distinguished themselves at the risk of their own life above and beyond the call of duty. In most situations, the medal is awarded posthumously. On this day, recipients of the medal are remembered and honored for their bravery and selflessness while in combat defending the United States against an enemy. It is always fitting to recall the sacrifices of these men and women, especially on Memorial Day.

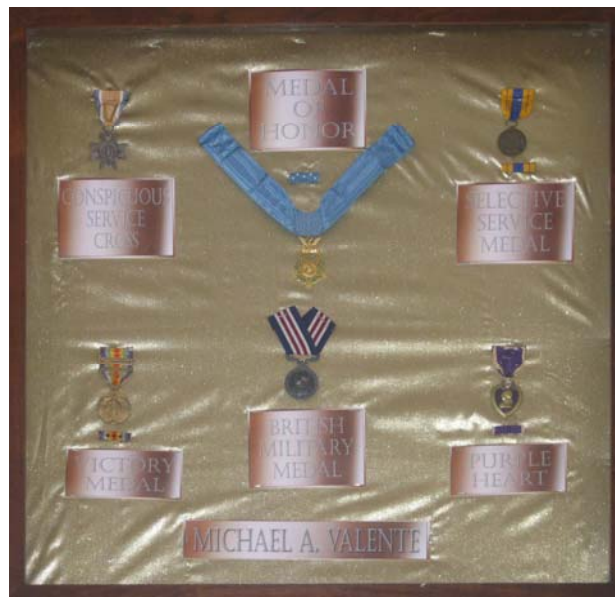
On March 25th, National Medal of Honor Day, Brother Bob and I attended a ceremony held in Long Beach to honor Italian-American Medal of Honor recipient, Michael A. Valente. The ceremony was well attended by OSIA, public officials, members of the Valente family and friends. This was a very moving tribute to a man who lived a life of service to his family, community, and most of all to his country.

The City of Long Beach renamed the Long Beach Bridge. It is now officially the Michael A. Valente Memorial Bridge. The idea was conceived by Ralph Madalena, President of the Michael A. Valente Lodge #2667, who is Michael Valente's grandson. He wrote to the Nassau County Executive and Long Beach City County Executive, as well as to government legislators, and veterans groups. With the support of OSIA and those to whom he wrote, his request was approved and the Nassau County Legislature voted to rename the bridge.

Michael Valente was a World War 1 U. S. Army Infantryman. His unit suffered heavy casualties in the trenches of France, and his heroic actions on an assault on machine gun nests earned him the Medal of Honor citation. President Herbert Hoover presented him with the Medal of Honor in 1929. He returned home, and lived in Long Beach until his death in 1976 at the age of 80.

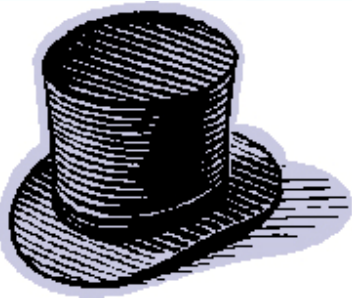


Portrait of

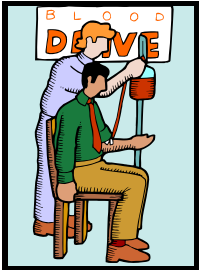

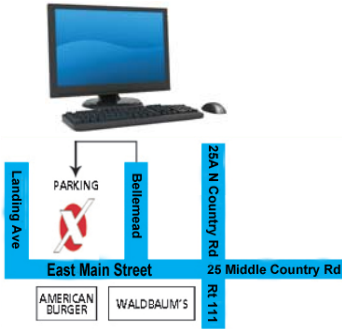

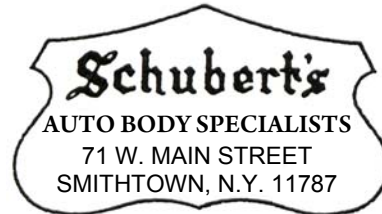
